



From the President BOB FLETCHER

Dear Friends.

As I retire and reflect on my thirteen years as President and CEO of the United Methodist Higher Education Foundation, I am reminded that this work is—above all else—a relational and connectional ministry. What a privilege it has been to be a part of it!

Before taking the job in 2011, I served on UMHEF's Board of Trustees and knew many people connected to the foundation. Back then, in an announcement about my new role, I said our programs would grow "by nurturing current relationships and creating new ones." Through the years, strengthening relationships has indeed been key to our growth and a source of great blessing for me personally.

By building relationships over these thirteen years, nineteen new scholarship endowments were launched, and our United Methodist Dollars for Scholars network grew by 85%. In addition to gifts from over 1,500 individuals, over 2,000 United Methodist churches, and twenty-nine annual conference foundations also supported this ministry. Friendships and connections have made it possible for us to award over \$28 million in scholarships that helped 13,200 students attend UM-related schools.

In the 2011 article, I also said, "UMHEF's ministry is of great importance to the future of The United Methodist Church. ...It is very important that we continue to grow and develop our programs for the benefit of our United Methodist institutions and students alike." Those words are even more true today as they were then, and I am confident the foundation will continue to impact students, their families, the Church, our educational institutions, and our global community for many years to come.

I am immensely grateful for our trustees, staff, and generous donors; and I give thanks for the churches, colleges, universities, and seminaries our scholarship recipients attend. Connecting students to the quality education those United Methodist-related schools offer is what this ministry is all about. Thank you, dear friends, for being partners in ministry.




Meet Nancy Young

One UMHEF Scholarship Helps Seminary Students Reach Milestones

UMHEF Scholar and Graduate of Boston University School of Theology For each of the three years that Sandra Barrios attended Boston University's School of Theology, she was awarded UMHEF's Foundation Merit Scholarship. This longstanding award, which was designated in 2019 to support United Methodist students attending UM-related theological schools, distributes \$3,000 scholarships each year to students nominated by their schools. Since 2019, \$555,000 has been awarded to 185 seminarians!

"There are not enough words to thank UMHEF and those involved in providing scholarships," Sandra shared. "It helped me during rough times and honestly, I wouldn't be able to graduate if it was not because of the scholarships I received. Thank you!"

Sandra reached two huge milestones this spring, graduating with a Master of Divinity degree and becoming a certified candidate in the New England Conference in which she is pursuing Ordination as a Deacon in The United Methodist Church. We give thanks for Sandra's call and for the support UMHEF has been able to provide her.

In lieu of flowers...

Those four words make a powerful statement, indicating the family of a deceased person, individual donors, or sometimes the deceased themselves chose to rally others in support of a favorite nonprofit instead of giving flowers for the funeral

It is common to include a request for tribute gifts in the obituary. If you want memorial gifts—in lieu of flowers—to be given to UMHEF when you die, be sure to share that with your family or include it in your will or other documents.

When such gifts are given to UMHEF, staff notifies the family or other designees that a gift was given. If you want to give in memory or in honor of someone, make that clear when you donate and provide the name and addresses of the people you want notified. When giving online, indicate you want to dedicate the gift, and provide the details.



ENDOWMENTS: Planned Gifts that Keep Giving

From time to time, UMHEF has the honor of working with individuals or families to establish endowment funds. The foundation has more than 130 named endowment funds that help financially support the scholarships we award to qualifying students. These funds may designate support to students from specific UM conferences, attending certain UM-related schools, or who meet other preset criteria. Endowments have an impact on students today and far into the future!

Remembering Rev. Dr. Jim Gilland

The UMHEF community mourns the passing of Rev. Dr. Jim Gilland of Salisbury, North Carolina. Jim was a strong advocate for young people pursuing careers in ministry, especially young North Carolinians studying at his alma mater, United Methodist-related Duke Divinity School.

Through the years, Jim pastored numerous churches in North Carolina, served as the Superintendent of the Greensboro District, and preached or taught in 394 churches and institutions around the globe. In addition to mentoring young ministers, Jim was a proponent of equality and world peace.

Upon Jim's retirement from ministry in 1998, Providence United Methodist Church in Salisbury established the Jim and Glener Gilland Scholarship Fund. Each year, this fund enables UMHEF to award a scholarship to a Duke Divinity School student from the Western NC Annual Conference.

In a letter to UMHEF President and CEO Bob Fletcher in late 2023, Glener acknowledged the impact of Jim's legacy. "I've been pleasantly surprised at the notes we've received from pastors telling us how much Jim meant to them when they were beginning their ministry," she wrote. "Now he can continue to help young pastors, just in a different way."

When he died in July of 2023, Jim's family invited people to give memorial gifts to the Gilland Scholarship Fund. Jim will leave an indelible mark on the lives of young ministers for years to come.
